Total fund allocated: £9575

The primary PE and sport premium 2016 to 2017 will be paid by the Secretary of State for Education to the local authority. The authority will then distribute the premium to maintained schools in its area as stated in Section 14 of the Education Act 2002.

The premium for the 2016 to 2017 academic year is paid in 2 installments from the Secretary of State to the authority as follows:
