## Year 6 Standard Assessment Tests (SATs)

With SATs week approaching for our Year 6 children, we have organised for another 'mock' SATs week on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> March, which will run in a similar style as the SATs week during the week commencing Monday 14<sup>th</sup> May.

Children are graded in the SATs in three categories: working towards the expected standard, working at the expected standard or working at greater depth. These will be reported to you as such, as well as receiving your children's raw score and a scaled score. Once we as a school receive the results in July we will check them, refer any mistakes and collate the results. We will then be in a position to send home the results by mid-July. During our 'mock' week, the children will be given their results and will have opportunities to revisit the test papers during class to celebrate their successes and learn from any misconceptions.

In class, your child is continuing to revise for the tests and all children will be encouraged to complete their Easter homework, designed to prepare them for the tests through a light timetable of revision during the fortnight holiday.

Your child will take these tests on the set dates below:

| Tuesday 15th May   | English: Reading  |
| Wednesday 16th May | Mathematics: Arithmetic (paper 1)<br>Mathematics: Reasoning (paper 2)     |
| Thursday 17th May  | Mathematics: Reasoning (paper 2)  |

Our 'mock' week will run in the same order as above, so please ensure your child has had plenty of rest and a hearty breakfast during the week commencing Monday 5<sup>th</sup> March. Details of our SATs Breakfast Club, which will take place during SATs week in May will be detailed in a letter after Easter.
